Why Toledo? Grassroots leaders from around the country frequently approach SAME asking about the possibility of starting a community café in their city. As a response, SAME developed the **Five Pillars of Readiness** for communities who want to establish and sustain a SAME Café – because it takes a whole community to raise a Café.

For over two years, friends of SAME in Toledo have worked to respond to the Pillars of Readiness by gathering a supportive coalition of partners to the table – restaurants, farms & gardens, donors, and volunteers, while seeking the right location. After unanimous SAME Board approval of Toledo's readiness, **SAME**Café Toledo is set to open in 2021!
